Mailings & Communications

We sent the November Touchstones journals with assistance from Liz Stewart and Norden Lucke. We are considering ceasing the Touchstone mailing, but continuing to offer it by email and on our website.

Cam sent out anniversary letters to all members who have joined the Fellowship in November.

Cam created weekly Gazettes and Chalice Connections, etc.

Cam regularly provided updates to our website, including the Foundation page, home-page metaslider, calendar, services, online Gazette, etc. and created an Eventbrite listing for the Tret Fure concert.

We are in the process of create a "members section."

We are also deciding how we are going to manage our listservs and email addresses, which remain on our original server. Cam has recommended contracting with someone with expertise in this area if the board wishes to proceed as collectively staff does not have this expertise.

Now that we have finished our new member welcome service, we will begin working on our annual directory. Cam expects the directory now will go out in December.

Finance

Cam has reconciled our October banking account statements and included this past month a monthly financial report in the Gazette. Pledges were up in October, which put us into the black.

The board is working to form a finance committee to assist with review and oversite of financial matters.

Safety Committee

Our Safety Committee met on November 16. They have completed its annual review of our Emergency Operation Plan content. Cam is working on formatting and integrating the changes into a new complete draft, which the committee expects to submit a revised EOP for the board's approval later this fall, hopefully in time for the board's December meeting.

Facilities

The test of our breezeway sprinkler drops came back with good news. Our sprinklers passed, and are certified for another 10 years of service.

With our next quarterly inspection, Gator Fire will perform a mandatory five-year test of the entire system (wet and dry).

Office Help

Liz Stewart has continued volunteering time in the office to assist with a variety of tasks, taking phone calls during our Tuesday staff meetings and assisting with Touchstone mailings and other rolls.

Music

This month, Derek planned the repertoire for services in December, including additional music for Chanukah, Christmas Eve, and a Music Sunday. He also worked with prominent choir members to improve his lesson plans and overall rehearsal planning.

Choir rehearsals included discussions about the history of some of these songs and how their implicit meanings have changed throughout the years.

Derek ordered the piece of staging described in his grant application, and it should arrive shortly after Thanksgiving.

Derek is learning the AV/Sound system so that there is a back up, if Garrett (our current AV/Tech) need time away. He has been hands on with the management of concert events and is managing guest musicians for upcoming Sunday services.

Derek was asked to attend the youth lock-in and talk about/lead some music during the event. Where the youth also asked if he would present and sing with them during the CON that they are planning.

Religious Education – First Hour

Religious education is in the process of rebranding as First Hour. This effort is to encourage everyone to participate in offerings and help remove the stigma of what that hour of reflection is.

This Month RE has been busy. Children and adult classes are in full swing, and youth continue to meet every Sunday after Service. RE is growing, and the new member family is settling in well.

There is one new child care Staff-person, Gabby Guzman - She is getting the hang of things and reports that she's very happy in the environment. James is enjoying the process of choosing the Sunday Service books, and is looking into a new curriculum for the Spring.

James ran a fundraiser for the RE Program on November 11th, \$150 was raised.

The Youth had a Lock-in on the weekend of November 18th-19th, and that went very well. They planned and produced a menu, and had a very productive year planning session. During the lock in

they wrote their new Covenant.

Messy playdate was also on the 19th, and was well attended.

James is working with another DRE in Tallahassee in getting OWL training in the spring next year, and has also been trying to communicate with the UCC church in Gainesville to see if they have plans. James has put out a call for interested trainees, and there are several interested already. As soon as we have more details available they will be confirming the dates.

James has implemented a new communications program called Remind that seems to be working well for the volunteer Teachers and Youth advisors. They are working to get a more consistent schedule for the volunteers.

CYREC met at the beginning of the month and is beginning the process of coming up with more formal policy for the Youth. Forms are being reviewed and updated with Covid precautions, and our volunteers are all being given and reviewing our current safety policy.

Adult RE (is currently planned by Rev Christe) – Cakes for the Queen of Heaven parts 1 & 2 has had a good run and will be closing soon.

Planning is under way for a different spring curriculum offering for adults.

Minister's Report to the Board

Beloveds,

Last month I posed some large questions thinking about who and what UUFG wants to be, but those questions are really just the beginning. We are asking the same questions most UU congregations are asking coming out of the pandemic.

This month I want to add to that thought by looking at the graphic shared in the board documents and considering how we might categorize and prioritize UUFG's reboot.



We are emerging out of a world crisis that is not yet over, but we need to examine how we can sustainably move forward. Some things no longer serve us, some things we began during COVID can carry us into the future, and some that were only needed to get us through. We learned a different way of connecting with those in the greater UU world on a regular basis. However, we need to decide together what serves this community and its faith development.

The current work of Article 2 is attempting to do exactly the same things, deciding how we are going to be and do, Unitarian Universalism in the future.

And we know this work will cause a great deal of anxiety. There is no expert in the room and because we have been doing UUism this way for enough years, we have assumed it would never change even as we, in this congregation and others, have changed.

As we deepen our commitment to widening the circles of concern, inviting in more and more people who have been historically marginalized and those who have felt disenfranchised, how does that change what our institutions and structural documents look like? How are our collective values reflected in our budgets, policies and procedures, and daily operations?

Yes, it seems overwhelming. It may feel as if things are changing too quickly. But what we really know deep down is that our systems have not been serving our people for far too long. And we have been complicit by not getting around to making changes because it is too much work or might make us uncomfortable.

But hope is born of conversation and relationship. If we can begin by gathering, having meaningful, open, and honest conversations, then we can create a community that is sustainable, accountable to its members and a beacon in the Gainesville, North Florida area. With so much division in this country, UUFG can be a lifesaving, living oasis for so many, even if they never come to the Fellowship or have need of its services.

The idea of being the beacon of hope in people's lives both inside and outside our walls is the promise I find different and exciting about our living faith. With a world that is ever changing, we choose to change along with it.

UUFG Governing Board Meeting Minutes

24 Oct 2022

Board members present: Diane DePuydt, Bev Giordano, Leah Cobb Lee, Norden Lucke,

- 1. Gathering and Meeting Preparation
 - a. Welcome, Call to Order, Quorum; Diane called the meeting to order at 6:30 pm. We have a quorum.
 - b. Chalice Lighting and Reading by Diane.
 - c. Board Covenant: All members read, "Inspired by our Unitarian Universalist principles, together we guide our congregation and its mission and vision with transparency, gratitude, and respect."
 - d. Personal check-in
 - e. Confirm and assign roles: Leah is timekeeper; Bev is writing gratitude cards; Jeanne Gossman is external observer.
 - f. Confirm agenda/any updates
- 2. Congregational Input Judith reported that the Leadership Development Committee (LDC) is pleased to have Tim Christy as its Board liaison. The LDC is working to activate a finance committee, redrafting the finance committee's charter, updating the job description for Treasurer, and pursuing people for the Treasurer position. Harry sent the Board an article that addresses some of the same questions posed by Rev Christe. Harry believes that this discussion should be congregation wide. Harry also inquired about the request for custodial assistance. Rev Christe responded that this request pertained to checking the restrooms with increased use, as our custodian works twice a week. Harry also noted that at least four members were unmasked last Sunday. Does the Board need to revisit the mask policy? Diane stated that if people begin rebelling, the Board will need to review the mask policy. Judith believes that the current mask policy should be enforced; ushers should give masks to those who are not wearing them. Harry stated that the Welcome Team definitely tells visitors to wear masks.
- 3. Consent Agenda
 - a. Ministerial & Staff Report (Att. 1)
 - b. Treasurer's Report for September (Att. 2)
 - c. Minutes of September 26, 2022, meeting (Att. 3)
 - d. Fellowship Council Report (Att. 4)

Motion: Bev moved to approve the consent agenda. Leah seconded, and the motion was passed unanimously.

- 4. Discussion/Action Items/Visioning Rev Christe sent Board members a reading from *Governance and Ministry* by Dan Hotchkiss.
 - a. Board Learning Discussion Rev Christe wants to be clear about shared ministry. The Board's ministry is to be sure we fulfill our mission and covenants. The

congregation is the third leg of shared ministry, along with the minister and Board. What is the board's job? Fiduciary responsibility, living well into our policy governance and our mission and covenant as an organization. We are not getting buy-in from the congregation. When will we have a Town Hall to pose these questions and have a conversation? Lots of new people are coming to UUFG. Need to look at our policies and ask if they still serve us. Are our policies too restrictive? Can new members immediately join teams?

The Board's task is to teach members to want something new. Rev Christe suggested reducing the number of groups/committees that we are trying to populate so we can strengthen and clarify our policies and strengthen the LDC to rebuild the leadership that suffered with COVID. We need to create events that remind people they want to be at UUFG. How do we funnel down to what we need to function? Pull back to regain strength, to let people rest, bring new people forward and give new energy. Tim noted that UUFG's mission statement was created in 2013; is it time to revise? Rev Christe recommends waiting until the larger UU community revises its mission statements.

Begin with getting people participating in Town Halls first to answer defining questions (who is UUFG? What do we want it to be?). Do this early in 2023. Advertise now during conversations with members at upcoming events. Could begin writing a revised mission statement in May and have a follow-up Town Hall to begin the process with the entire UUFG community.

- b. Liaison portfolios and monthly reports need reports to come back to Board after Board members communicate with their groups monthly. Are Board members meeting with their teams? Are the teams functioning? Diane reported that the Fellowship Council meets regularly; CYREC is trying to reconstitute itself. Leah noted that she was supposed to be part of the Finance Committee as Board liaison. Tim met with LDC.
- c. Honor Congregation (Att. 5) Rev Christe announced that Honor Congregation is a big deal. It recognizes that UUFG gave UUA our full fair-share money, even with a deficit budget. Not many Honor Congregations. This designation gives us a different status level. Can we continue to do this? Have to work out with Finance Committee. Pay it quarterly at present. Payment must be made to have voting rights at the annual UUA meeting.

5. Management and Facilities:

a. Foundation Grants Review (Att. 6) – Jeanne Gossman reviewed the six applications that have been submitted to the Foundation. The Foundation presents them to the Board to be sure they are complimentary/align with needs and purposes of UUFG. The six applications were for updated nametags, new gutters, safety barricades, youth room update, choir risers, and road banners. Norden and Diane expressed safety concerns about putting banners on 34th Street, as this would open us up to

more danger. Rev Christe noted that safety concerns would depend on the divisiveness of wording on banners. Harry noted that this is an issue to be considered by the Safety Committee. Leah spoke in favor of the flags. The Membership Committee might consider the flag suggestion, as it looks at outreach and membership. Motion: Leah moved to <u>not</u> affirm this grant proposal at this time. Norden seconded, and the motion passed unanimously. Someone asked about the readability of the new nametags with more complex design. Rev Christe noted that the new design has the same dimensions as the old nametags and that they are very legible. New members are getting the new design. Existing members could have their pronouns on the new nametags. Motion: Leah moved to affirm that the remaining five proposals be accepted; Tim seconded; unanimous approval.

- b. Building Usage nothing scheduled after January 1.
 - c. Property Sale Enquiry Response Letter (Att. 7)- Rev Christe reported that we sent the response letter to the inquiry made by attorneys for the potential purchaser. Marilyn Roberts looked at the piece of property in question. Selling this piece of UUFG's property would square off our property and the homeowner's property. It is 0.34 of an acre and is completely overgrown. It might appraise at \$14,790. The next step is up to the potential buyer, and then we would need to take it to the congregation.

6. Leadership and Governance

- a. Leadership Development- Judith, Harry, and Warren Hodge met with Rev Christe to discuss continued training for current Board members and future leaders. They proposed having an all-day Board retreat with an outside facilitator to work on the nuts and bolts of board functioning. Potential topic: training in conducting difficult conversations, beginning with the Board and then having a Sunday afternoon workshop for the congregation with the same facilitator. Decision: Feb 4, 2023, for the Board retreat; Feb 5 for the congregational training.
- b. CYREC Policy Change (Att. 8) –Leah, who is on CYREC, explained that the current safety policies have contradictions. Parents of some teens are concerned about one part of the safety policy, which implies that even teens must be signed in by a guardian. This is not practical, as many of our teens walk or drive to UUFG independently of their parents. CYREC is asking the Board to address this one minor change (i.e., change the word *minor* to *children* so the teens don't have to be signed in by a guardian). Motion: Tim moved to accept this change in wording in the policy. Norden seconded, and the motion passed 4-0 with Leah abstaining.
- c. January 2023 Congregational Meeting- this is a Social Justice meeting. Our Social Justice Committee has not yet received a letter, so the Board can wait until the November meeting to set the Congregational Meeting date.

- a. Emerging Concerns Leah had seen Cam's notes about creating a member section on the website/server/email addresses. Debra Neill-Moreci is willing to do some of this, but we will need to hire someone to migrate our email addresses to a new server. We outsource this server.
- b. Calendaring & Action Items Feb 4 Board retreat and Feb 5 congregational training about holding difficult conversations.
- c. Gratitudes-none
- d. Board Process everything went well; finished ahead of schedule.

New GRU Meter and Fee Structure

Our Heating System

Functionally, we have seven air handlers that we use to heat our space. Each air handler has two, in some cases maybe three metal strips used for heating. When the air handler's thermostat prompts the heating unit to come on, its metal strips start glowing red-hot. Forced air warms over the strips and heats the specific space. Each system can heat a given space fairly quickly but uses significant electricity.

Background Information – Demand Schedule

We have been on a "Demand Schedule" billing arrangement for many years. This system was designed for larger businesses and institutions and was intended to incentivize them to avoid using large amounts of energy during peak times.

GRU monitors our usage in 15 minute increments. If and when we went over 50 kw demand in any 15 minute interval, we were put on a more expensive Demand Schedule rate for our usage over the next 11 months. Since we consistently go over that 50 kw threshold every January and February, we have stayed rooted on the Demand Schedule fee structure. In February, historically, our peak usage has gone over 70 kw quite regularly.

New Fee Schedule

Now, however, we will be on a fee model designed for churches. So long as our peak demand stays below 50 kw during Monday through Friday, then we will stay on the lower fixed rate for electricity, regardless of our usage on Saturday or Sunday. If our peak demand goes above 50 kw Monday through Friday, then we would go back on the Demand Schedule rate structure.

In principle, in addition to allowing us to go off of the Demand Schedule pricing, the new meter should allow us to get better information about our usage. At this point, we have to ask GRU for a report, but in the future GRU hopes to make these reports available online.

Conclusions

Once the new meter is installed and working, we should be able to run tests to determine how power much each unit draws when heating. On those future "weekday" occasions during cold snaps when we have one really big event spread out over the campus, or when we have multiple events going simultaneously, then we might consider a strategy to "pre-heat" certain spaces or otherwise stagger the use of these units to avoid a certain number of units (or specific large units) coming on at the same time.
