
In addition, Social Justice will offer a guide to tax credits and rebates on both new and used electric vehicles.

UUFG has served with Family Promise for over 20 years. It is an interfaith organization that

works with homeless families to help them get back on their feet. Local churches take turns providing shelter and meals. It is both fulfilling and labor-intensive. Many volunteers are needed during the weeks a congregation hosts families.

The pandemic changed the way Family Promise operated, and UUFG turned from providing direct shelter to providing meals and other support while the families were put up in motels. Consequently, many members of our congregation have never volunteered or know what is entailed in hosting Family Promise in person.

Pat Caren, our Family Promise coordinator, will be tabling on Sunday, April 16 to help you explore the benefits of Family Promise and the work required to host in person.
