- Guidance for our delegates at the UUA General Assembly, regarding proposed Article II revisions

Please plan to attend this important meeting. Childcare will be provided. We will have a short break after service for people to have a snack outside before the meeting begins. Cookies and coffee will be available, but please bring a bag lunch for yourself and your children if needed.
