Know Your Voting Rights

Write Letters and Postcards to Encourage Voting

Each Sunday stop by the Social Justice Action Table to learn how you can encourage voting as part of the nationwide program with UUtheVote. You may choose to print letters at home and add a few sentences about why you vote, or write postcards with a prepared script. These motivational messages will be sent to infrequent voters to encourage them to vote in upcoming elections. Share the Plate with Florida Rights Restoration Coalition

Sunday, September 18, in 11:00 am Service

On September 18, we "Share the Plate" with Florida Rights Restoration Coalition (FRRC), an organization committed to ending the disenfranchisement of and discrimination against people with convictions. For those with past convictions in Florida, FRRC is working to remove barriers to employment, housing, and opportunities.

For those who want to register to vote, but still owe fines and fees as part of their sentence, FRRC is working to remove those financial barriers. At this Service all non-designated donations will be given to the Florida Rights Restoration Coalition.
