SOCIAL JUSTICE ACTIVITIES FOR FEBRUARY

Sunday, February 19, 10 am in Classroom 3, and in 11 am in Service Share the Plate with Peaceful Paths

Come at 10 am for a First Hour informal time to meet Peaceful Paths staff and learn more about their work. This certified domestic violence center serves survivors of domestic violence in Alachua, Bradford, and Union counties. Peaceful Paths provides a wide range of services including emergency shelter, 24-hour helpline, victim advocacy, children's programming, economic empowerment education and support, crisis counseling and support groups, community awareness and intervention, and violence prevention programs. At this Service all non-designated donations will be given to Peaceful Paths.

Sunday, February 19 during coffee hour Sign Clean Water Petition

We are working to help get a constitutional amendment on the 2024 ballot to make it illegal to harm Florida's waters. Current laws are ineffective which is why Florida waters continue to get more polluted. This amendment would grant all Floridians a fundamental right to clean and healthy waters. The key word is "fundamental." This fundamental right would take precedence over the permitted rights of polluters and enable us to hold the state accountable when it permits the degradation of our waters. We think that most Floridians want clean water, and this amendment will allow them to vote for clean water during the next election. Monday, February 20, 7 pm on Zoom Social Justice Movie: "Lowndes County and the Road to Black Power"

This movie opens with interviews with men and women who grew up in the titular Alabama county in the 1960s. The Black interviewees, children of sharecroppers, recall an atmosphere of poverty, racism and bloody violence; their white counterparts, members of landowning families, remember a "peaceful, almost idyllic place." These discrepant versions of life in Lowndes set the stage for Sam Pollard and Geeta Gandbhir's documentary, which retraces the story of how one of the most inequitable, fiercely segregated counties in America gave rise to a national movement for Black power.

Social Justice Common Read for Spring: Stayed on Freedom: The Long History of Black Power Through One Family's Journey



Registration has opened for this coming year's General Assembly in Pittsburg, PA, running from June 21 - 25, 2023. General Assembly 2023 will be a multiplatform event, with registration options for in-person and/or virtual participation.

In-person registration includes access to events scheduled to take place in Pittsburgh, as well as everything available to virtual registrants. Full virtual registration includes access to the GA app, as well as all on-demand programming, live webinars, and live-streamed events.

New this year! Join our First Timers Caucus. If this will be your first ever in-person GA, use the promo code WELCOME to reduce your Adult inperson registration by \$100. One hundred spots are available. Cannot be combined with other financial support promo codes.

In-person registration is \$400 for adults, and \$300 for high school youth, emerging adults (18-24), and retired and candidate ministers. Full Virtual Registration is \$250. Register now and use the payment plan to pay over time. Financial support is also available. *In-person registration rates will increase on March 1 and again on May 1*.

Andrew "Finn the Fiddler" Magill has straddled the line of "fiddler" and "violinist" for the better part of his thirty years. Raised in an Irish musical household in Asheville, North Carolina he grew up studying with many of the best traditional American and Irish fiddlers at The Swannanoa Gathering music workshops. At age 18, his debut record Drive & Lift was featured on NPR and ten years later, Magill released his 2016 double-disc concept album Roots and Branches, debuting at #46 on the Folk DJ charts.

Guitarist, bouzouki player and singer Alan Murray lives in Boston, Massachusetts, where he has established himself as an in-demand performer and teacher on the Irish music scene. He currently plays and tours with many of the finest traditional musicians today, and has taught classes at such prestigious music programs as Warren Wilson college's Swanannoa Gathering, Catskills Irish Arts Week, Fairbanks Summer Arts Festival, The Flaherty Retreat, and the University of Louisiana and Connecticut's Scared Heart U
