Bread of the Mighty Food Bank will be our organization to receive our Share the Plate collection this Sunday, June **Food** 18. Bread of the Mighty serves five Bank counties: Alachua, Dixie, Gilchrist, Lafayette and Levy. They collect, sort, store and distribute donated food and

basic essentials to more than 170 nonprofit agency partners such as food pantries, churches, homeless shelters and other organizations who then distribute food to directly feed the hungry. Two of those organizations are also very important to UUFG as they work with Food4Kids which we contribute to and which helps provide food on weekends to students at Westwood Middle School, where children from Pineridge attend.

A UPDATE FROM OUR INTERIM MINISTER SEARCH COMMITTEE

The Interim Minister Search Committee would like to give you an update on where we are in the process. Unfortunately, we did not get a match for an interim minister. We join 15 other UU congregations nationwide that did not get a match for an interim minister. There is a shortage of ministers who are available to fill this role. We currently intend to re-enter our application for an interim minister next spring when that process re-opens.

The UUA automatically changed our request for an interim minister to a request for a contract minister. The differences between an interim minister and a contract minister are numerous, but basically an interim minister is generally full time, works with us for two years, and helps us prepare for a full time settled minister. A contract minister could be full time or part time, on site or remote, and generally does not help prepare a congregation for a settled minister.

We have identified three possible outcomes in our search for a contract minister. Reverend Christe has been an enormous asset in helping us understand our options, and our chances of success with each outcome. Those outcomes include the following, in order of preference:

Outcome 1: We find a full-time contract minister. This would be our best case, but the least likely to actually happen due to a shortage of contract ministers.

Outcome 2: We find a part-time, in-person, contract minister who could perform all the duties of a minister, but on a part-time basis. This outcome also seems less likely.

Outcome 3: We find a remote part time contract minister who would help us with governance and staff supervision but would not provide worship services or pastoral care.

If we cannot find an in-person contract minister, and we must pursue the third option, Reverend Christe suggests we may reach out to ministers at area liberal churches, such as Gainesville UCC and/or Westminster Presbyterian, for help with pastoral care on a contractual basis. Or we could develop an in-house pastoral care committee that would look after our pastoral care needs. This option would, of course, depend on the support of volunteers from the congregation. Also, we may reach out to UUA ministers from other Florida congregations to officiate at weddings and memorial services.

The interim search committee will provide regular updates on our progress on this journey. Please feel free to reach out with any input or questions to any member of the committee.
