

**SWEETWATER BRANCH TOUR**

In keeping with our environmental theme this year, Social Justice invites you to enjoy a refreshing tour around Sweetwater Wetlands Park.

We have two options.

**Option 1** — ride on an electric tram designed for 8 people who have disabilities. The ride is one hour long. The date is Friday, March 17 at 11:00 am.

**Option 2** is for anyone able to walk a half mile to a mile on sidewalks, boardwalks and gravel.

Both tours will learn about the environmental wonders of Sweetwater Wetlands, a wildlife and birding hotspot that is also a water treatment plant. You will need water, hat, comfortable clothing and shoes for walking if you are in group 2. Meet in the parking lot.

The cost is \$5 per car or \$2 per person. Sweetwater Park is on Williston Rd. just east of South Main St at 325 SW Williston Road.

As we have discussed at our Fellowship on a number of occasions, the Unitarian Universalist Association is currently reviewing Article 2 of the UUA’s bylaws, which help define Unitarian Universalism’s principles and sources. The form is not yet available — this is the proposed process, so the form will be made available after the process is actually approved.

Discussion workshops for all will then most likely be the second week of May.

Delegates may submit amendments up through the GA mini assembly, but last-minute amendments may not be considered for priority.

Just to be clear: the vote at General Assembly 2023 (this year) is to continue the conversation — not to adopt.
