Effervescent and engaging, Boston-based fiddler **Hanneke Cassel's** style fuses influences from the Isle of Skye and Cape Breton with Americana grooves and musical innovations, creating a cutting-edge acoustic sound that retains the integrity and spirit of the Scottish tradition.

While Cassel has established herself as a leader in the *contemporary* Scottish fiddle scene, this year she embarked on a project with guitarist **Yann Falquet** to record the traditional tunes that inspired her love for Scottish music. Falquet, who has toured regularly throughout Canada, the U.S., Europe and Australia with Québécois band *Genticorum*, is a driving, captivating musician who helps breathe life into these old reels, strathspeys, jigs, and airs. But Yann also is well known for developing a personal guitar style for Québec folk music, inspired by the playing of the accompanists of different cultures (Brittany, Scandinavia, Ireland, North America).
