ANNUAL CONGREGATIONAL MEETING RESULTS

Last Sunday, May 7, our Fellowship held its annual congregational meeting. After quorum was established, membership voted on the following items:

- Approval of the 2022-2023 Annual Meeting minutes (passed unanimously)
- Approval of the FY 2023-2024 budget (passed 46 yes, 4 no, 1 abstention)
- Changes to Bylaws affecting composition of the Governing Board, making all Board terms two years, approving five as the number of individuals on the Leadership Development Committee (passed 51 yes, 1 abstention)
- Approval of the slate of officers and trustees for the UUFG Board: Leah Cobb Lee, President; Mike Hazlett, Vice President/President-Elect; Erin Parish, Secretary; Mary Anthony, Treasurer; Tom Mareci, Trustee. Board Trustees Tim Christy and Norden Lucke will continue until June 30, 2024 (passed unanimously).
- Approval of the slate of members for the Leadership Development Committee: Susan Christy, Liz Stewart, and Judith Kendall. Aaron Broadwell and Warren Hodge will continue until June 30, 2024 (passed unanimously)
- Approval of the proposal to continue the discussion of Article 2 (passed 43 yes, 18 no, 6 abstentions).
