GOVERNING BOARD AFFIRMS UUFG MASKING POLICY

At its May meeting, our Governing Board voted to continue our masking policy in order to maintain high levels of safety and "live into our values" as a Welcoming Congregation, centering the safety of those who are immunocompromised or at high risk.

Sunday services: We continue to ask attendees at our Sunday worship services to wear masks. If you don't have a mask handy when you arrive, you can pick one up at our Welcome Table.

Other UUFG events: Attendees may agree to make masking optional. Please have a mask available as you arrive.

Non-UUFG events on our campus: We encourage masking. However masking is at the discretion of the event coordinator.

GOVERNING BOARD UPDATE FOR THE CONGREGATION

The UUFG Board met on May 22, 2023. These are the highlights of the meeting. The Board voted to:

- Approve a credit card for our DRE;
- Continue masking in the Sanctuary during Sunday service;
- Open the "interim minister campaign" to the entire congregation and save the funds to support an interim minister;
- Approve Susan Christy as Chair of the 2024 UUFG Auction.

The Board also authorized Tim Christy to reconvene the search committee to explore other options, as our first round of the interim minister search did not produce a candidate.

SIGN A PETITION TO GET ABORTION RIGHTS ON THE STATE CONSTITUTION

Sunday, May 28, 12:00 pm

This Sunday, May 28, please sign a petition to protect abortion and reproductive rights in Florida. Look for Nancy Parkinson, who will be tabling after service during coffee hour.

Nancy reports, "A coalition of organizations led by Floridians Protecting Freedom is gathering petitions for a ballot amendment that would add language to the State constitution that 'no law shall prohibit, penalize, delay, or restrict abortion before viability or when necessary to protect the patient's health, as determined by the patient's healthcare provider.' The coalition includes the ACLU and Planned Parenthood."
