THE MINISTER'S STOLE: A CREATION STORY

V. Fruition

Bringing this beautiful work of art to fruition was truly a labor of love. Debra estimates the number of hours spent collaborating, purchasing materials, cutting, sewing, embellishing, at least 30 to 40 hours apiece.

Most of my time was researching, creating graphics and doing the computer illustrations (I had the SOCUUPS logo and the Rev's already) so they could be translated to patterns for the cloth design. We worked together on the layout from the beginning of the project starting with the original sketch.

Deborah spent hours embellishing with threads, cords, beading; cutting, applying the backing, and attaching the applique' to the stole cloth. We worked together on the layout — the original diverse people graphic was changed once Deborah realized it was too complicated (the hair part).

I created another simpler, non-gender image in layers and we laid the paper cutouts on the stole to see how the layout of the profiles would work. We then picked the fabric and Deborah proceeded with creating the final cloth pieces. She had the brilliant idea of using the black beads once the applique was attached to the stole front.







James Chase, our Director of Religious Education, is contributing their professionalgrade photographic skills to help raise funds for our children and youth religious education program!


