Part II. Conception

It is traditional for a gift to be given at the Installation of a newly settled UU minister. Knowing this, several folks began to ponder what that might be. In sleuthing this out, the Two Deborah/Debras determined that Rev. Christe had requested a stole to commemorate the day. Stoles originated in the priesthood and are meant to convey a message of the person's self and beliefs. They are of high importance for ceremonies.

A generic stole could have been ordered and presented, but our Deborah/Debras decided to make it much more personal and determined to create original artwork that would reflect Rev. Christe's important personal themes: CUUPS (Paganism), LGBTQ+, Sankofa Bird, Social Justice, Black Lives Matter, and Diversity. And, just to make it more special, Rev.
